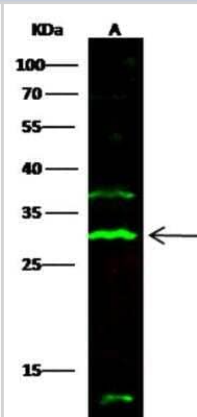

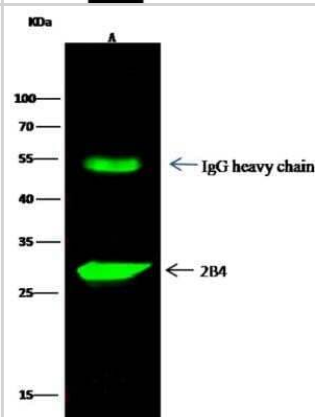

Developed using the Odyssey technique. Performed under reducing conditions. Predicted band size:42 kDa Observed band size:28 kDa (We are unsure as to the identity of these extra bands.)

Primary antibody: Anti-2B4 rabbit monoclonal antibody, at 1:200 dilution Secondary antibody: Dylight 800-labeled antibody to rabbit IgG (H+L), at 1:5000 dilution Developed using the odssey technique.
