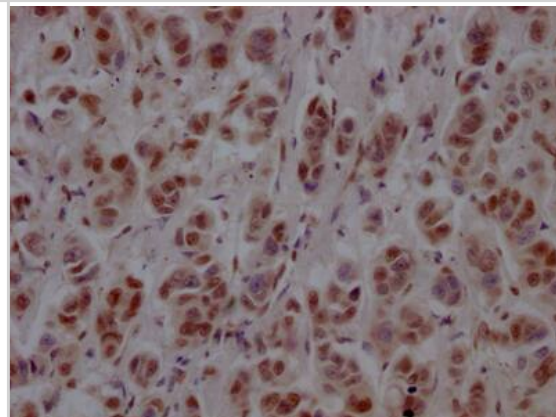

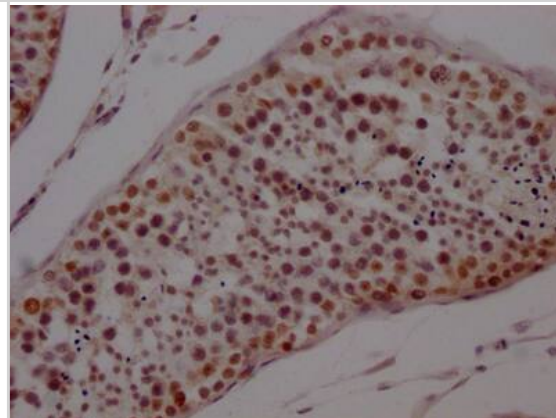

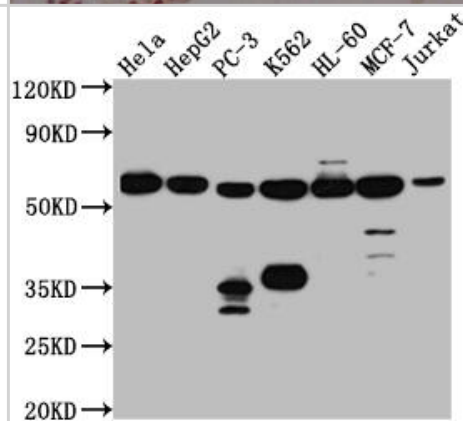
Immunohistochemistry: PTBP1 Antibody (8A1) [NBP3-26363] - Image of PTBP1 Antibody (8A1) diluted at 1:100 and staining in paraffin-embedded human breast cancer performed. After dewaxing and hydration, antigen retrieval was mediated by high pressure in a citrate buffer (pH 6.0). Section was blocked with 10% normal goat serum 30min at RT. Then primary antibody (1% BSA) was incubated at 4C overnight. The primary is detected by a Goat anti-rabbit IgG polymer labeled by HRP and visualized using 0.05% DAB.



Immunohistochemistry: PTBP1 Antibody (8A1) [NBP3-26363] - Image of PTBP1 Antibody (8A1) diluted at 1:100 and staining in paraffin-embedded human breast cancer performed.
